## Group #1

<sup>10</sup> He was in the world, and the world was made through Him, and the world did not know Him.

1. The Condition: His Presence - He was in the world

2. The Group: World (Creation)

3. His Identity: **Creator** 

4. The Result: NO Recognition

**John 17:25** *O righteous Father! The world has not known You, but I have known You; and these have known that You sent Me.* 

## Group #2

<sup>11</sup> He came to His own, and His own did not receive Him.

1. The Condition: **Presentation** 

2. The Group: His own (Nation)

3. His Identity: King / Messiah

4. The Result: Rejection

## Group #3

<sup>12</sup> But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, to those who believe in His name:

1. The Condition: **Presentation** 

2. The Group: Receivers (Individual)

a. Individuals (personal action) - individual matter

b. Universal offer

3. The Gift: Authority to become children of God

a. v. 10 - "became"

- b. We are not children of God before receiving Him
- c. Those that go against the current of the masses
- d. Results in a change in status
- 4. His Identity: Him... His name...
  - a. Jesus' Identity Who He is
  - b. Jesus' Ability / Authority What He can do John 17:2 "as You have given Him authority over all flesh, that He should give eternal life to as many as You have given Him.
  - c. Jesus' Credibility What He has promised
- 5. The Result: Reception (Belief)
  - 2:23 Now when He was in Jerusalem at the Passover, during the feast, many believed in His name when they saw the signs which He did.
  - 3:18 "He who believes in Him is not condemned; but he who does not believe is condemned already, because he has not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God.
  - 20:31 but these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing you may have life in His name.
  - c.p. 8:58 Jesus said to them, "Most assuredly, I say to you, before Abraham was, I AM."

Believing "in the name of Jesus" is found only in John and 1 John; it implies "acceptance of Jesus to the full extent of his revelation" <sup>1</sup>
