God's Serving Team: Pastors & Deacons

God's Word Teaches That There Are Two Offices in the Local Church

- 1. Spiritual <u>Leaders</u> (Pastors, Shepherds, Elders, Overseers)
 - a. who are appointed by God (Eph 4:11; 1 Tim 1:12)

(Eph 4:11-12) And He Himself gave some to be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, and some pastors and teachers, for the equipping of the saints for the work of ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ,

(1 Tim 1:12) And I thank Christ Jesus our Lord who has enabled me, because He counted me faithful, putting me into the ministry,

- b. who are assigned the tasks of:
 - equipping the saints (Eph 4:12)
 - shepherding the flock (1 Peter 5:1-4)
 - feeding the flock (John 21:15-17; 1 Tim 5:17-18)
 - guarding the flock from within & without (Acts 20:28-30; Heb 13:17),
 - restricting who teaches and what is taught (1 Tim 1:3-7)
 - overseeing the flock (1 Pet 5:1-4)
- c. who are affirmed by other spiritual leaders (2 Tim 4:14; Titus 1:5)
- d. who are accountable to God (Heb 13:17) as believers, each of us has the responsibility to confront an erring brother. Pastors are additionally accountable to the Lord to teach His Word clearly (2 Tim 4:1-4) and accurately (2 Tim 2:15).
- 2. Servant Helpers (Deacons, Servants)

(Acts 6:1) Now in those days, when [the number of] the disciples was multiplying, there arose a complaint against the Hebrews by the Hellenists, because their widows were neglected in the daily distribution.
