ACTS 1:1-3

¹The former account I made, O Theophilus, of all that Jesus began both to do and teach, ² until the day in which He was taken up, after He through the Holy Spirit had given commandments to **THE APOSTLES WHOM** He had chosen, ³ to **WHOM** He also presented Himself alive after His suffering by many infallible proofs, being seen by **THEM** during forty days and speaking of the things pertaining to the kingdom of God.

ACTS 1:4-5

⁴ And being assembled together with [them], He commanded **THEM** not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the Promise of the Father, "which," [He said,] "**YOU** have heard from Me; ⁵ "for John truly baptized with water, but **YOU** shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now." ⁶ Therefore, when **THEY** had come together, **THEY** asked Him, saying, "Lord, will You at this time restore the kingdom to Israel?"

ACTS 1:7-9

⁷ And He said to **THEM**, "It is not for **YOU** to know times or seasons which the Father has put in His own authority. ⁸ "But **YOU** shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon **YOU**; and **YOU** shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth." ⁹ Now when He had spoken these things, while **THEY** watched, He was taken up, and a cloud received Him out of **THEIR** sight.

ACTS 1:10-12

¹⁰ And while **THEY** looked steadfastly toward heaven as He went up, behold, two men stood by **THEM** in white apparel, ¹¹ who also said, "**MEN** of Galilee, why do **YOU** stand gazing up into heaven? This [same] Jesus, who was taken up from **YOU** into heaven, will so come in like manner as **YOU** saw Him go into heaven." ¹² Then **THEY** returned to Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is near Jerusalem, a Sabbath day's journey.

ACTS 1:13-14

13 And when **THEY** had entered, **THEY** went up into the upper room where **THEY** were staying: **Peter**, **James**, **John**, and **Andrew**; **Philip** and **Thomas**; **Bartholomew** and **Matthew**; **James** [the son] of Alphaeus and **Simon** the Zealot; and **Judas** the son of James. ¹⁴ **THESE** all continued with one accord in prayer and supplication, with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus, and with His brothers.

- e. commanded to wait for the Promise of the Father (4b-5)
- f. explained the limits regarding times or seasons (7)
- The Apostles. g. promised power through the Holy Spirit (8a)
- h. instructs to be witnesses (Great Comm) (8b)
- i. ascends into the sky (9)

MATTHEW 28:16-20 | Who Is "Them"?

WHY DOES IT MATTER?

Jesus commanded "the apostles" vs "everyone"

- Determines if Jesus defined a church leadership or not.
- Defines the **nature** of the local church or not.
- Indicates if there is **responsibility** and **accountability** or not.
- Emphasizes the need for thorough **training** or not.
- Differentiates between **gender** responsibilities or not.
- Suggests **age** and **maturity** prerequisites for service or not.

ACTS | It Does Matter...

As with the Gospels, Acts identifies the Apostles as:

- Chosen by Jesus
- Trained by Jesus
- Adults
- Men
- By Name

EPH 2:19-22 | It Does Matter...

¹⁹ Now, therefore, you are no longer strangers and foreigners, but fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God, ²⁰ having been built on the foundation of the APOSTLES and prophets, Jesus Christ Himself being the chief cornerstone, ²¹ in whom the whole building, being joined together, grows into a holy temple in the Lord, ²² in whom you also are being built together for a dwelling place of God in the Spirit.

EPH 4:11-13 | It Does Matter...

¹¹ And He Himself gave some [to be] **APOSTLES**, some **prophets**, some **evangelists**, and some **pastors and teachers**, ¹² for the equipping of the saints for the work of ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ, ¹³ till we all come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to a perfect man, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ;

WHY DOES IT MATTER?

The Impact of the Apostles as the Foundation

- Not apostolic succession
- Rather apostolic foundation
 - Directed by their leadership, divine authority, and decisions
 - Directed by their immediate revelation from God (early church)
 - Directed by their written revelation from God (Eph 2:20)
 - Directed by the God-given leadership structure (Eph 4:11ff)

WHY DOES IT MATTER?

Jesus directly commissioned the APOSTLES as the foundational, authoritative leaders of the soon-to-be future church.

Through His working through His APOSTLES, Jesus established the foundation for local church order, leadership qualifications, authority structure, accountability, and reaffirmed gender roles.
