God Explains Marriage – *Ephesians 5:22-33 (Part 5)*

²² Wives, submit to your own husbands, as to the Lord. ²³ For the husband is head of the wife, as also Christ is head of the church; and He is the Savior of the body. ²⁴ Therefore, just as the church is subject to Christ, so *let* the wives *be* to their own husbands in everything.

²⁵ Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ also loved the church and gave Himself for her, ²⁶ that He might sanctify and cleanse her with the washing of water by the word, ²⁷ that He might present her to Himself a glorious church, not having spot or wrinkle or any such thing, but that she should be holy and without blemish. ²⁸ So husbands ought to love their own wives as their own bodies; he who loves his wife loves himself. ²⁹ For no one ever hated his own flesh, but nourishes and cherishes it, just as the Lord *does* the church. ³⁰ For we are members of His body, of His flesh and of His bones. ³¹ "For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh." ³² This is a great mystery, but I speak concerning Christ and the church.

³³ Nevertheless let each one of you in particular so love his own wife as himself, and let the wife *see* that she respects *her* husband.

6 Preliminary Observations

- 1. My Marriage Role Is Based Upon My <u>Gender</u> (not chosen or interchangeable)
- 2. My Marriage Role Is Commanded (not an option or a feeling)
- 3. My Marriage Role Is Without Conditions (no "when" or "unless" he/she does this)
- 4. My Marriage Role Focuses on My Actions Toward My Spouse
- 5. My Marriage Role Assumes an Imperfect Spouse (submit/love anyway)
- 6. My Marriage Role Is Built Upon a Spiritual Relationship (broadcast by example)

4 Principles for the Wife

- 1. Respond in Your Role (each role has different "submission" responsibilities)
- 2. Allow God's Plan to Work (one cannot [easily] lead someone who is unwilling to follow)
- 3. WHAT: Wives Are to Submit to Their Own Husbands (yielding to my God-assigned auth)
- 4. HOW: Wives Are to Submit as to the Lord
 - Measure: As to the Lord / As the church is subject to Christ
 - Method (v. 33): "The wife ... to respect [lit. fear] her husband." (position not person)

First Observations for the Husbands

- God Begins with Wives but Has Much More to Say to Husbands Wives → 40 words vs. Husbands → 112 words (in Greek)
- 2. God Requires Wives Only to Submit, but Husbands to Sacrifice
- 3. God Gives Wives One Command, but Husbands Many Tasks
 - LOVE your wife
 - Give yourself for your wife
 - Sanctify your wife
 - Cleanse your wife
 - Nourish your wife
 - Cherish your wife

4. God's Measurement to Husbands Seems to Be More Strict

- Wives are to submit "as to the Lord."
- Husbands are to love "just as Christ loved the Church."

More Observations for the Husbands

1. If "love" must be commanded, it does not happen naturally.

- a. This must be taught to boys and men.
- b. This must be learned by boys and men.
- c. This must be obeyed by men.

2. The goals of sanctify and cleanse assume imperfection.

- a. To sanctify is to set apart or to make holy
- b. To sanctify can thus begin with the unholy
- c. To cleanse is to being with the unclean

3. We must enter marriage with Biblical expectations.

HUSBANDS:

- a. I <u>understand</u> that my wife is not perfect.
- b. I accept her with her imperfections.
- c. My job is to help her, not criticize her.

WIVES:

- a. I acknowledge my need of sanctification and cleansing.
- b. I accept God's provision to grow me spiritually.
- c. I <u>allow</u> my husband to help me to grow spiritually.
 - A wife must enter marriage with the understanding of her need and a willingness to enter this process
 - Willingness to allow her husband to lead & to grow her spiritually

4. A husband is to focus on the spiritual needs of his wife.

- a. My focus is not on me but on my wife
- b. My focus is not what <u>I</u>need, but what <u>she</u> needs
- c. My wife's spiritual maturity is my God-given assignment
- d. Love is not <u>ignoring</u> faults it's acknowledging them and addressing them

5. A husband is to proactively provide spiritual leadership

- a. Requires purpose
- b. Requires preparation
- c. Requires a plan
- d. Requires an ongoing process
- e. Requires <u>progress</u> lead from where you are!
