God Explains Marriage – Ephesians 5:22-33 (Part 6)

- ²² Wives, submit to your own husbands, as to the Lord. ²³ For the husband is head of the wife, as also Christ is head of the church; and He is the Savior of the body. ²⁴ Therefore, just as the church is subject to Christ, so *let* the wives *be* to their own husbands in everything.
- ²⁵ Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ also loved the church and gave Himself for her, ²⁶ that He might sanctify and cleanse her with the washing of water by the word, ²⁷ that He might present her to Himself a glorious church, not having spot or wrinkle or any such thing, but that she should be holy and without blemish.
- ²⁸ So husbands ought to love their own wives as their own bodies; he who loves his wife loves himself. ²⁹ For no one ever hated his own flesh, but nourishes and cherishes it, just as the Lord *does* the church. ³⁰ For we are members of His body, of His flesh and of His bones. ³¹ "For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh." ³² This is a great mystery, but I speak concerning Christ and the church.
- ³³ Nevertheless let each one of you in particular so love his own wife as himself, and let the wife *see* that she respects *her* husband.

6 Preliminary Observations

- 1. My Marriage Role Is Based Upon My Gender (not chosen or interchangeable)
- 2. My Marriage Role Is Commanded (not an option or a feeling)
- 3. My Marriage Role Is Without Conditions (no "when" or "unless" he/she does this)
- 4. My Marriage Role Focuses on My Actions Toward My Spouse
- 5. My Marriage Role Assumes an Imperfect Spouse (submit/love anyway)
- 6. My Marriage Role Is Built Upon a Spiritual Relationship (broadcast by example)

4 Principles for the Wife

- 1. Respond in Your Role (each role has different "submission" responsibilities)
- 2. Allow God's Plan to Work (one cannot [easily] lead someone who is unwilling to follow)
- 3. WHAT: Wives Are to Submit to Their Own Husbands (yielding to my God-assigned auth)
- 4. HOW: Wives Are to Submit as to the Lord
 - Measure: As to the Lord / As the church is subject to Christ
 - Method (v. 33): "The wife ... to respect [lit. fear] her husband." (position not person)

First Observations for the Husbands

- 1. God Begins with Wives but Has Much More to Say to Husbands (40 vs 112 words)
- 2. God Requires Wives Only to Submit, but Husbands to Sacrifice
- 3. God Gives Wives One Command, but Husbands Many Tasks
 - LOVE give yourself for sanctify cleanse nourish cherish your wife
- 4. God's Measurement to Husbands Seems to Be More Strict
 - Wives "as to the Lord" vs husbands "just as Christ loved the Church."

More Observations for the Husbands

- 1. If "love" must be commanded, it does not happen naturally.
- 2. The goals of sanctify and cleanse assume imperfection.
- 3. We must enter marriage with Biblical expectations.
- 4. A husband is to focus on the spiritual needs of his wife.
- 5. A husband is to proactively provide spiritual leadership

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A Husband Is to Love His Wife (25)

- Command Present action "be loving" your wife
- Comparison Perfect example "as Christ loved the church"
- Cost Precious price "and gave Himself"
- Covered Preferred object "for her"

We're Commanded to Love Multiple Times:

- 1. Love Our Enemies (Matt 5:44, Luke 6:27, 6:35)
- 2. Love One Another (John 13:34, 15:12,17, 1 Pet 2:17)
- 3. Husbands: Love Your Wives (Eph 5:25, Col 3:19)
 - Double Responsibility | Double Effort | Double Focus

3 "Befores" of Love - Before You Can Love, You Must Have:

- 1. The Right Order (Luke 14:26 Before all other relationships)
- 2. The Right Purpose (1 Cor 13:1-3 Actions with the right motives)
- 3. The Right Target (1 John 2:15 Our wife cannot be displaced by other things)

How a Husband Is to Love His Wife (25)

(or, How Did Christ Love the Church?)

I am to love my wife...

- 1. At the expense of My own...:
 - Comfort & Convenience (1 Pet 2:21-24)
 - Life (John 13:1; Gal 2:20; Eph 5:2)
- 2. With a focus on what my wife needs:
 - (As opposed to what the Church wanted...)
 - <u>Leadership</u> (Gen 2:16-17; Eph 1:22; 4:15; 5:23)
 - <u>Instruction</u> (Eph 4:11-16)
 - Sanctification (Eph 5:26)
 - Protection (Acts 9:4)
 - **Provision** (1 John 3:16-17)
 - Mercy & Grace (Titus 3:5; Heb 4:16)
- 3. With an attitude of humility (Phil 2:1-8):
 - Esteem her higher than yourself
 - Consider her <u>needs</u> as well as your own
 - Be willing to shed your own reputation (or pursuit of one)
 - Count her as worth <u>living</u> for, and worth <u>dying</u> for
- 4. With loving behavior (1 Cor 13:4-7):
 - What love <u>looks</u> like and <u>sounds</u> like
