[Thayer] γογγυσμός, γογγυσμοῦ, ὁ (γογγύζω, which see), a murmur, murmuring, muttering; applied to a. secret debate: περί τίνος, John 7:12. b. secret displeasure, not openly avowed: πρός τινα, Acts 6:1; in plural χωρίς or ἄνευ γογγυσμῶν without querulous discontent, without murmurings, i. e. with a cheerful and willing mind, Phil. 2:14; 1 Pet. 4:9 (where L T Tr WH read the singular). (Exo. 16:7ff; Sap. 1:10f; Antoninus 9, 37.)\*

John 7:12 And there was much complaining among the people concerning Him. Some said, "He is good"; others said, "No, on the contrary, He deceives the people."

### [Thayer] διαλογισμός

διαλογισμός, διαλογισμοῦ, ὁ (διαλογίζομαι), the Septuagint for Δημς, and Chaldean ζημς, in Greek writings from Plato down, the thinking of a man deliberating with himself, hence, 1. a thought, inward reasoning: Luke 2:35; 5:22; 6:8; 9:46f; Rom. 14:1 (yet some bring this under 2); the reasoning of those who think themselves to be wise, Rom. 1:21; 1 Cor. 3:20; an opinion: κριταί διαλογισμῶν πονηρῶν, judges with evil thoughts, i. e. who follow perverse opinions, reprehensible principles, James 2:4 (cf. Winer's Grammar, 187 (176)); purpose, design: Matt. 15:19; Mark 7:21. 2. a deliberating, questioning, about what is true: Luke 24:38; when in reference to what ought to be done, hesitation, doubting: χωρίς γογγυσμῶν καί διαλογισμῶν, Phil. 2:14 (γογγυσμῶν is the moral, διαλογισμῶν the intellectual rebellion against God' Lightfoot); χωρίς ὀργῆς καί διαλογισμοῦ, 1 Tim. 2:8; (in the last two passages others still advocate the rendering disputing; yet cf. Meyer on Philippians the passage cited).\*

Matt 15:19 "For out of the heart proceed evil thoughts, murders, adulteries, fornications, thefts, false witness, blasphemies.

Luke 9:46 Then a dispute arose among them as to which of them would be greatest.

Rom 1:21 because, although they knew God, they did not glorify *Him* as God, nor were thankful, but became futile in their thoughts, and their foolish hearts were darkened.

Rom 14:1 Receive one who is weak in the faith, but not to disputes over doubtful things.

1 Cor 3:20 and again, "The LORD knows the thoughts of the wise, that they are futile."

καὶ πάλιν· κύριος γινώσκει τοὺς διαλογισμοὺς τῶν σοφῶν ὅτι εἰσὶν μάταιοι.

Phil 2:14 Do all things without complaining and disputing,

1 Tim 2:8 I desire therefore that the men pray everywhere, lifting up holy hands, without wrath and doubting;

Βούλομαι οὖν προσεύχεσθαι τοὺς ἄνδρας ἐν παντὶ τόπῳ ἐπαίροντας ὁσίους χεῖρας χωρὶς ὀργῆς καὶ διαλογισμοῦ.

James 2:4 have you not shown partiality among yourselves, and become judges with evil thoughts?

[Thayer] ἄμεμπτος, -ον (μέμφομαι to blame), blameless, deserving no censure (Tertullian irreprehensibilis), free from fault or defect. Luke 1:6; Phil. 2:15; 3:6;

1 Thess. 3:13 (WH marginal reading ἀμέμπτως); Heb. 8:7 (in which nothing is lacking); in the Septuagint equivalent to Δ̄ਸ੍ਰ, Job 1:1,8 etc., common in Greek writings. (Cf. Trench, sec. ciii.)\*

[Thayer]  $\dot{a}\mu\dot{\epsilon}\mu\pi\tau\omega\varsigma$ 

ἀμέμπτως, adverb, blamelessly, so that there is no cause for censure: 1 Thess. 2:10; (3:13 WH marginal reading); 5:23. (From Aeschylus down. Cf. Trench, sec. ciii.)\*

Luke 1:6 And they were both righteous before God, walking in all the commandments and ordinances of the Lord blameless.

ἦσαν δὲ δίκαιοι ἀμφότεροι ἐναντίον τοῦ θεοῦ, πορευόμενοι ἐν πάσαις ταῖς ἐντολαῖς καὶ δικαιώμασιν τοῦ κυρίου ἄμεμπτοι.

Phil 2:15 that you may become blameless and harmless, children of God without fault in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world,

ἵνα γένησθε ἄμεμπτοι καὶ ἀκέραιοι, τέκνα θεοῦ ἄμωμα μέσον γενεᾶς σκολιᾶς καὶ διεστραμμένης, ἐν οἶς φαίνεσθε ὡς φωστῆρες ἐν κόσμῳ,

Phil 3:6 concerning zeal, persecuting the church; concerning the righteousness which is in the law, blameless.

1 Thes 3:13 so that He may establish your hearts blameless in holiness before our God and Father at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ with all His saints. εἰς τὸ στηρίξαι ὑμῶν τὰς καρδίας ἀμέμπτους ἐν ἀγιωσύνῃ ἔμπροσθεν τοῦ θεοῦ καὶ πατρὸς ἡμῶν ἐν τῇ παρουσία τοῦ κυρίου ἡμῶν Ἰησοῦ μετὰ πάντων τῶν ἀγίων αὐτοῦ, [ἀμήν].

Heb 8:7 For if that first *covenant* had been faultless, then no place would have been sought for a second.

[Thayer] ἀκέραιος, -ον (κεράννυμι); a. *unmixed, pure,* as wine, metals, b. of the mind, *without admixture of evil, free from guile, innocent, simple*: Matt. 10:16; Rom. 16:19; Phil. 2:15; (and frequent in secular writings). (Cf. Ellicott on Philippians, the passage cited; Trench, sec. Ivi.; Tittmann 1:27f.)\*

Matt 10:16 "Behold, I send you out as sheep in the midst of wolves. Therefore be wise as serpents and harmless as doves.

Rom 16:19 For your obedience has become known to all. Therefore I am glad on your behalf; but I want you to be wise in what is good, and simple concerning evil.

Phil 2:15 that you may become blameless and harmless, children of God without fault in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world,

ἵνα γένησθε ἄμεμπτοι καὶ ἀκέραιοι, τέκνα θεοῦ ἄμωμα μέσον γενεᾶς σκολιᾶς καὶ διεστραμμένης, ἐν οἶς φαίνεσθε ὡς φωστῆρες ἐν κόσμῳ,

[Thayer] ἄμωμος, -ον (μῶμος), without blemish, free from faultiness, as a victim without spot or blemish: 1 Pet. 1:19 (Lev. 22:21); Heb. 9:14; in both places allusion is made to the sinless life of Christ. Ethically, without blemish, faultless, unblamable: Eph. 1:4; 5:27; Col. 1:22; Phil. 2:15 L T Tr WH; Jude 1:24; Rev. 14:5. (Often in the Septuagint; (Hesiod, Simonides, Jamblichus), Herodotus 2, 177; Aeschylus Pers. 185; Theocritus, 18, 25.) (Synonym: see Trench, sec. ciii.; Tittmann 1:29f.)\*

Eph 1:4 just as He chose us in Him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and without blame before Him in love,

καθως ἐξελέξατο ἡμᾶς ἐν αὐτῷ πρὸ καταβολῆς κόσμου εἶναι ἡμᾶς ἀγίους καὶ ἀμώμους κατενώπιον αὐτοῦ ἐν ἀγάπη,

Eph 5:27 that He might present her to Himself a glorious church, not having spot or wrinkle or any such thing, but that she should be holy and without blemish. ἵνα παραστήση αὐτὸς ἑαυτῷ ἔνδοξον τὴν ἐκκλησίαν, μὴ ἔχουσαν σπίλον ἢ ῥυτίδα ἤ τι τῶν τοιούτων, ἀλλὶ ἵνα ἢ ἀγία καὶ ἄμωμος.

Phil 2:15 that you may become blameless and harmless, children of God without fault in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world,

ΐνα γένησθε ἄμεμπτοι καὶ ἀκέραιοι, τέκνα θεοῦ ἄμωμα μέσον γενεᾶς σκολιᾶς καὶ διεστραμμένης, ἐν οἶς φαίνεσθε ὡς φωστῆρες ἐν κόσμω,

Col 1:21 And you, who once were alienated and enemies in your mind by wicked works, yet now He has reconciled

νυνὶ δὲ ἀποκατήλλαξεν ἐν τῷ σώματι τῆς σαρκὸς αὐτοῦ διὰ τοῦ θανάτου παραστῆσαι ὑμᾶς ἀγίους καὶ ἀμώμους καὶ ἀνεγκλήτους κατενώπιον αὐτοῦ,

Heb 9:14 how much more shall the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered Himself without spot to God, cleanse your conscience from dead works to serve the living God?

πόσφ μᾶλλον τὸ αἶμα τοῦ Χριστοῦ, ὃς διὰ πνεύματος αἰωνίου έαυτὸν προσήνεγκεν ἄμωμον τῷ θεῷ, καθαριεῖ τὴν συνείδησιν ἡμῶν ἀπὸ νεκρῶν ἔργων εἰς τὸ λατρεύειν θεῷ ζῶντι.

1 Pet 1:19 but with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot.

άλλὰ τιμίω αἵματι ὡς ἀμνοῦ ἀμώμου καὶ ἀσπίλου Χριστοῦ,

Jude 1:24 Now to Him who is able to keep you from stumbling, And to present you faultless Before the presence of His glory with exceeding joy,

Τῷ δὲ δυναμένφ φυλάξαι ὑμᾶς ἀπταίστους καὶ στῆσαι κατενώπιον τῆς δόξης αὐτοῦ ἀμώμους ἐν ἀγαλλιάσει,

Rev 14:5 And in their mouth was found no deceit, for they are without fault before the throne of God.

καὶ ἐν τῷ στόματι αὐτῶν οὐχ εύρέθη ψεῦδος, ἄμωμοί εἰσιν.

[Thayer] **σκολιός**, σκολιός, σκολιόν (opposed to ὀρθός, ὄρθιος, εὐθύς (cf. σκώληξ)), from Homer down, *crooked, curved*: properly, of a way (Prov. 28:18), τά σκολιά, Luke 3:5 (opposed to ἡ εὐθεῖα namely, ὀδός, from Isa. 40:4); metaphorically, *perverse, wicked*: ἡ γενεά ἡ σκολιά, Acts 2:40; with διεστραμμένη added, Phil. 2:15 (clearly so Deut. 32:5); *unfair, surly, froward* (opposed to ἀγαθός καί ἐπιεικής), 1 Pet. 2:18.\*

Luke 3:5 Every valley shall be filled And every mountain and hill brought low; The crooked places shall be made straight And the rough ways smooth;

πᾶσα φάραγξ πληρωθήσεται καὶ πᾶν ὄρος καὶ βουνὸς ταπεινωθήσεται, καὶ ἔσται τὰ σκολιὰ εἰς εὐθείαν καὶ αἱ τραχεῖαι εἰς ὁδοὺς λείας·

Acts 2:40 And with many other words he testified and exhorted them, saying, "Be saved from this perverse generation."

έτέροις τε λόγοις πλείοσιν διεμαρτύρατο καὶ παρεκάλει αὐτοὺς λέγων· σώθητε ἀπὸ τῆς γενεᾶς τῆς σκολιᾶς ταύτης.

Phil 2:15 that you may become blameless and harmless, children of God without fault in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world,

1 Pet 2:18 Servants, be submissive to your masters with all fear, not only to the good and gentle, but also to the harsh.

[Thayer] διαστρέφω; 1 aorist infinitive διαστρέψαι; passive participle διεστραμμένος (cf. WH's Appendix, p. 170f); from Aeschylus down; a. to distort, turn aside: τάς ὁδούς κυρίου τάς εὐθείας, figuratively (Prov. 10:10), to oppose, plot against, the saving purposes and plans of God, Acts 13:10. Hence, b. to turn aside from the right path, to pervert, corrupt: τό ἔθνος, Luke 23:2 (Polybius 5, 41, 1; 8, 24, 3); τινα ἀπό τίνος, to corrupt and so turn one aside from, etc. Acts 13:8 (Exo. 5:4; voluptates animum detorquent a virtute, Cicero); διεστραμμένος, perverse, corrupt, wicked: Matt. 17:17; Luke 9:41; Acts 20:30; Phil. 2:15.\* Matt 17:17 Then Jesus answered and said, "O faithless and perverse generation, how long shall I be with you? How long shall I bear with you? Bring him here to Me."

ἀποκριθεὶς δὲ ὁ Ἰησοῦς εἶπεν· ὦ γενεὰ ἄπιστος καὶ διεστραμμένη, ἕως πότε μεθ' ὑμῶν ἔσομαι; ἕως πότε ἀνέξομαι ὑμῶν; φέρετέ μοι αὐτὸν ὧδε.

Luke 9:41 Then Jesus answered and said, "O faithless and perverse generation, how long shall I be with you and bear with you? Bring your son here."

Luke 23:2 And they began to accuse Him, saying, "We found this *fellow* perverting the nation, and forbidding to pay taxes to Caesar, saying that He Himself is Christ, a King."

Acts 13:8 But Elymas the sorcerer (for so his name is translated) withstood them, seeking to turn the proconsul away from the faith.

Acts 13:10 and said, "O full of all deceit and all fraud, *you* son of the devil, *you* enemy of all righteousness, will you not cease perverting the straight ways of the Lord?

εἶπεν· ὧ πλήρης παντὸς δόλου καὶ πάσης ῥαδιουργίας, υἱὲ διαβόλου, ἐχθρὲ πάσης δικαιοσύνης, οὐ παύση διαστρέφων τὰς ὁδοὺς [τοῦ] κυρίου τὰς εὐθείας; Acts 20:30 "Also from among yourselves men will rise up, speaking perverse things, to draw away the disciples after themselves.

Phil 2:15 that you may become blameless and harmless, children of God without fault in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world,

ἵνα γένησθε ἄμεμπτοι καὶ ἀκέραιοι, τέκνα θεοῦ ἄμωμα μέσον γενεᾶς σκολιᾶς καὶ διεστραμμένης, ἐν οἶς φαίνεσθε ὡς φωστῆρες ἐν κόσμῷ,
