Who Am I? Understanding Our Identity in Christ

Colossians 1:1 **BGT** Παῦλος ἀπόστολος Χριστοῦ Ἰησοῦ διὰ θελήματος θεοῦ καὶ Τιμόθεος ὁ ἀδελφὸς NKJ Paul, an apostle of Jesus Christ by the will of God, and Timothy our brother **KES** Paul, an apostle of Jesus Christ through will of God, and Timothy the brother Individuals, but not individualistic; we are in groups and have identities given to us by God. THE WRITER - "Paul" (means " ") Paul's given Jewish name was Saul ("asked for") — the name of the only king from the tribe of Benjamin. Named after a celebrity of whom he was related! Paul's changing of his name (possibly his Gentile name) seems to indicate Paul's transition from proud Pharisee to humble servant of the Lord as he grew spiritually. (56 AD) 1 Cor 15:9-10 – For I am the least of the apostles, who am not worthy to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. But by the grace of God I am what I am, and His grace toward me was not in vain; but I labored more abundantly than they all, yet not I, but the grace of God [which was] with me. (60-61 AD) Eph 3:7-8 – of which I became a minister according to the gift of the grace of God given to me by the effective working of His power. To me, who am less than the least of all the saints, this grace was given, that I should preach among the Gentiles the unsearchable riches of Christ, (62 AD) 1 Tim 1:15-16 - This is a faithful saying and worthy of all acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am chief. However, for this reason I obtained mercy, that in me first Jesus Christ might show all longsuffering, as a pattern to those who are going to believe on Him for everlasting life. Saul – the enemy of Christ → directly approached by Jesus – GOD'S GRACE TO SAVE ANYONE God used to proclaim the gospel to the known world, and to write 13 books of the NT (here, in prison) Is there progress in your life? Are you growing in the grace and knowledge of the Lord? THE WRITER'S – "an apostle of Jesus Christ" – one with a Paul was chosen to lead and sent by Jesus Christ. The concept of his divine appointment involves his authority from God and his accountability to God. Apostles were foundational to the establishment of the church (Eph 2:20), and seem to have been temporary. Qualifications included knowing Christ personally. Apostles appeared to receive direct revelation from God, and have direct authority of God. Eph 2:19-20 - Now, therefore, you are no longer strangers and foreigners, but fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God, having been built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Jesus Christ Himself being the chief corner [stone], God provided the foundation necessary to properly establish the church. God had a plan from before time! He has stated it (Matt 28:18-20). Are you working with His plan, or against it? The church is not an accident, or a hodge podge, but a detailed, defined entity begun supernaturally by God. Is it part of your plan? Does your plan coincide with God's plan? THE WRITER'S _____ - "by the will of God" - ____ choice, not ____ choice Eph 4:9-11 indicates that God appoints specific men, gifting them to perform specific abilities, with specific authority to minister to specific people in specific places at specific times. God chooses these as He wills (cp spiritual gifts). These positions are not self-selected or self-described. God's program built on foundation of God's leadership. Gal 1:1 Paul, an apostle (not from men nor through man, but through Jesus Christ and God the Father who raised

Him from the dead), - divine origin of Paul's apostleship

Eph 4:9-11 - (Now this, "He ascended"--what does it mean but that He also first descended into the lower parts of the earth? He who descended is also the One who ascended far above all the heavens, that He might fill all things.) And He Himself gave some [to be] apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, and some pastors and teachers,

Hebrews 13:17 - Obey those who rule over you, and be submissive, for they watch out for your souls, as those who must give account. Let them do so with joy and not with grief, for that would be unprofitable for you.

Do you acknowledge God's rulership in the affairs of men? In choosing your leaders? Do you believe what the Word says when it states that no authority comes unless it is from God? Do you submit (saying "yes" when you want to say "no") to God's ordained leaders?
