7	Aristarchus means "," which was a title applied to Aristarchus was from Thessalonica (Acts 20:4) and possibly grew up under a heavy pagan influence. Though Paul refers to Aristarchus as his "fellow prisoner," the only "chain" on him appears to be, the bond of perfection: Col 3:14 "But above all these things put on love, which is the bond of perfection."
