## Paul's Hope and Expectation for the Thessalonian Believers (1 Thes 3:8-13) or, What's a Grown-Up Believer Look Like?

1 Thessalonians 3:8 For now we live, if you stand fast in the Lord. 9 For what thanks can we render to God for you, for all the joy with which we rejoice for your sake before our God, 10 night and day praying exceedingly that we may see your face and perfect what is lacking in your faith? 11 Now may our God and Father Himself, and our Lord Jesus Christ, direct our way to you. and may the Lord make you increase and abound in love to one another and to all, just as we do to you, so that He may establish your hearts blameless in holiness before our God and Father at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ with all His saints.

στήκω [steko] stand; stand firm

- Mark 3:31 Then His brothers and His mother came, and standing outside they sent to Him, calling Him.
- 1 Corinthians 16:13 Watch, stand fast in the faith, be brave, be strong.
- **Gal 5:1** Stand fast therefore in the liberty by which Christ has made us free, and do not be entangled again with a yoke of bondage.
- Phil 1:27 Only let your conduct be worthy of the gospel of Christ, so that whether I come and see you or am
  absent, I may hear of your affairs, that you stand fast in one spirit, with one mind striving together for the faith
  of the gospel,
- Phil 4:1 Therefore, my beloved and longed-for brethren, my joy and crown, so stand fast in the Lord, beloved.
- 2 Thes 2:15 Therefore, brethren, stand fast and hold the traditions which you were taught, whether by word or our epistle.

That Paul would get the chance to see them, in order to \_\_\_\_\_ what was \_\_\_\_ in their faith (9-10) καταρτίζω mend, restore, set right, make complete (midd. strive for perfection 2 Cor 13.11); act. and midd. make, prepare, supply (κατηρτισμένος fully trained Lk 6.40) [telos → finish; katartidzo → fix]
  - **Ezra 4:12** Let it be known to the king that the Jews who came up from you have come to us at Jerusalem, and are building the rebellious and evil city, and are finishing *its* walls and repairing the foundations.
  - Matt 4:21 Going on from there, He saw two other brothers, James *the son* of Zebedee, and John his brother, in the boat with Zebedee their father, mending their nets. He called them,
  - Luke 6:40 "A disciple is not above his teacher, but everyone who is perfectly trained will be like his teacher. οὐκ ἔστιν μαθητὴς ὑπὲρ τὸν διδάσκαλον· κατηρτισμένος δὲ πᾶς ἔσται ὡς ὁ διδάσκαλος αὐτοῦ.
  - 1 Cor 1:10 Now I plead with you, brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that you all speak the same thing, and *that* there be no divisions among you, but *that* you be perfectly joined together in the same mind and in the same judgment.
  - 2 Cor 13:11 Finally, brethren, farewell. Become complete. Be of good comfort, be of one mind, live in peace; and the God of love and peace will be with you.
  - **Gal 6:1** Brethren, if a man is overtaken in any trespass, you who *are* spiritual restore such a one in a spirit of gentleness, considering yourself lest you also be tempted.
  - **Heb 13:20-21** Now may the God of peace who brought up our Lord Jesus from the dead, that great Shepherd of the sheep, through the blood of the everlasting covenant, make you complete in every good work to do His will, working in you what is well pleasing in His sight, through Jesus Christ, to whom *be* glory forever and ever. Amen.
  - 1 Peter 5:10 But may the God of all grace, who called us to His eternal glory by Christ Jesus, after you have suffered a while, perfect, establish, strengthen, and settle *you*.

ὑστέρημα, τος n [husterma] what is lacking, need, want; absence (of a person); poverty (Lk 21.4)

- Luke 21:4 "for all these out of their abundance have put in offerings for God, but she out of her poverty put in all the livelihood that she had."
- **2 Cor 9:12** For the administration of this service not only supplies the needs of the saints, but also is abounding through many thanksgivings to God,

ὑμᾶς δὲ ὁ κύριος πλεονάσαι καὶ περισσεύσαι τῆ ἀγάπη εἰς ἀλλήλους καὶ εἰς πάντας καθάπερ καὶ ἡμεῖς εἰς ὑμᾶς, πλεονάζω [plenadzo] intrans. increase, grow, become more, be extended; have too much ( $\underline{2 \text{ Cor } 8.15}$ ); trans. cause to grow or increase (1 Th 3.12)

περισσεύω [perisseo] intrans. be left over, be more than enough (  $\tau \delta \pi$ . what is left; wealth, ample possessions); increase, abound, overflow; excel, exceed; have plenty, have more than enough; be better off (1 Cor 8.8);  $\pi$ . μ $\hat{\alpha}\lambda\lambda$ ον do even more (1 Th 4.1, 10); trans. cause to increase or abound; provide in abundance

- Matt 14:20 So they all ate and were filled, and they took up twelve baskets full of the fragments that remained.
- Luke 12:15 And He said to them, "Take heed and beware of covetousness, for one's life does not consist in the abundance of the things he possesses."
- **John 6:13** Therefore they gathered *them* up, and filled twelve baskets with the fragments of the five barley loaves which were left over by those who had eaten.
- 1 Cor 15:58 Therefore, my beloved brethren, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that your labor is not in vain in the Lord.
- 2 Cor 8:2 that in a great trial of affliction the abundance of their joy and their deep poverty abounded in the riches of their liberality.
- **2 Cor 9:8** And God *is* able to make all grace abound toward you, that you, always having all sufficiency in all *things*, may have an abundance for every good work.
- **Phil 4:12** I know how to be abased, and I know how to abound. Everywhere and in all things I have learned both to be full and to be hungry, both to abound and to suffer need.
- 1 Thes 4:1 Finally then, brethren, we urge and exhort in the Lord Jesus that you should abound more and more, just as you received from us how you ought to walk and to please God;
- 1 Thes 4:10 and indeed you do so toward all the brethren who are in all Macedonia. But we urge you, brethren, that you increase more and more;

Paul's example: 1 Thes 2:1-12

## 4. That God would <u>fixate</u> their hearts <u>blameless</u> in <u>active</u> <u>holiness</u> as judged in the presence of God at the return of their Lord Jesus

**στηρίζω** [steridzo] strengthen, make firm, establish; fix, set up; τὸ πρόσωπον ς. make a firm resolve

- 1 Thes 3:2 and sent Timothy, our brother and minister of God, and our fellow laborer in the gospel of Christ, to establish you and encourage you concerning your faith,
- 2 Thes 2:17 comfort your hearts and establish you in every good word and work.
- 2 Thes 3:3 But the Lord is faithful, who will establish you and guard you from the evil one.
- James 5:8 You also be patient. Establish your hearts, for the coming of the Lord is at hand.

ἄμεμπτος, ον blameless, faultless

- **Gen 17:1** When Abram was ninety-nine years old, the LORD appeared to Abram and said to him, "I *am* Almighty God; walk before Me and be blameless.
- **Job 1:1** There was a man in the land of Uz, whose name *was* Job; and that man was blameless and upright, and one who feared God and shunned evil.
- Then the LORD said to Satan, "Have you considered My servant Job, that *there is* none like him on the earth, a blameless and upright man, one who fears God and shuns evil?" (cf. Job 2:3; 4:17; 9:20; 11:14)
- Luke 1:6 And they [Zacharias and Elisabeth] were both righteous before God, walking in all the commandments and ordinances of the Lord blameless.
- Phil 2:15 that you may become blameless and harmless, children of God without fault in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world,

άγιωσύνη, ης f [hagiosune] holiness; consecration

- Rom 1:4 and declared to be the Son of God with power according to the Spirit of holiness, by the resurrection from the dead.
- 2 Cor 7:1 Therefore, having these promises, beloved, let us cleanse ourselves from all filthiness of the flesh and spirit, perfecting holiness in the fear of God.
