12 Precautions (Hebrews 3:12 – 4:16)

- 1. Admit that you could become a spiritual casualty (12)
- 2. Perform a heart check-up (12)
- 3. Make encouragement from others easy to get (13)
- 4. Ask others to watch your <u>blind side</u> (13)
- 5. Understand that there are no <u>prizes</u> for <u>quitters</u> (14)
 - You lose your rewards in heaven (2 John 1:8)
 - You miss the chance to earn rewards
 - You set yourself up to God's punishment
 - You lose your joy for living
 - (Rom 15:13; 2 Cor 8:2; Gal 5:22; 1 John 1:4)
 - You stack the deck against your marriage
 - You start your kids on a course for hell (Mark
 - You encourage other saved people to give up too
 - You give unsaved people more arguments to stav away
 - You lose the chance to make life really count (Mt 16:24-27)
 - You are afraid to die, because you have to face Jesus
 - (Mark 8:35-38, 1 John 2:28)
 - You lose the chance of a full return (1 Cor 9:27; 1 Tim 1:18-20)
 - You lose your qualification to lead in the future
 - You miss the chance to fully experience God in this life
 - You miss God's intended purpose for your life
 - You discover that all that sin promised was a lie, and you fell for it.
 (John 12:25-26, Rom 13:12ff, Heb 10:35)
 - You miss out on God's inner peace (Phil 4:6-7)
- 6. Learn from those who've <u>blown</u> it (before you do) (16-18)

Hebrews 3

- 12 Beware, brethren, lest there be in any of you an evil heart of unbelief in departing from the living God;
- 13 but exhort one another daily, while it is called "Today," lest any of you be hardened through the deceitfulness of sin.
- 14 For we have become partakers of Christ if we hold the beginning of our confidence steadfast to the end.
- 15 while it is said:
 "Today, if you will hear
 His voice, Do not
 harden your hearts as
 in the rebellion."
- 16 For who, having heard, rebelled? Indeed, [was it] not all who came out of Egypt, [led] by Moses?
- 17 Now with whom was He angry forty years? [Was it] not with those who sinned, whose corpses fell in the wilderness?
- 18 And to whom did He swear that they would not enter His rest, but to those who did not obey?
- 19 So we see that they could not enter in because of unbelief.

7. Take both necessary truth steps: learn it & live it (4:1-6)

8. Work <u>hard</u> & <u>steady</u> for Christ (4:11)

9. Allow the Bible to <u>search</u> your <u>heart</u> (12)

10. Remind yourself that <u>God sees</u> everything you do (13)

11. Develop a "hang-on-no-matter-what" mindset (14)

12. Ask <u>God</u> for the <u>help</u> He's offered for the asking (15-16)

Hebrews 4

- 1 Therefore, since a promise remains of entering His rest, let us fear lest any of you seem to have come short of it.
 2 For indeed the gospel was preached to us as well as to them; but the word which they heard did not profit them, not being mixed with faith in those who heard fit.
- 3 For we who have believed do enter that rest, as He has said: "So I swore in My wrath, 'They shall not enter My rest,' " although the works were finished from the foundation of the world.
- 4 For He has spoken in a certain place of the seventh [day] in this way: "And God rested on the seventh day from all His works";
- 5 and again in this [place:] "They shall not enter My rest."
- 6 Since therefore it remains that some [must] enter it, and those to whom it was first preached did not enter because of disobedience.
- 7 again He designates a certain day, saying in David, "Today," after such a long time, as it has been said: "Today, if you will hear His voice, Do not harden your hearts."
- 8 For if Joshua had given them rest, then He would not afterward have spoken of another day.
- 9 There remains therefore a rest for the people of God.
- 10 For he who has entered His rest has himself also ceased from his works as God [did] from His.
- that rest, lest anyone fall according to the same example of disobedience. 12 For the word of God [is] living and powerful, and sharper than any twoedged sword, piercing even to the division of soul and spirit, and of joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart.

11 Let us therefore be diligent to enter

- 13 And there is no creature hidden from His sight, but all things [are] naked and open to the eyes of Him to whom we [must give] account.
- 14 Seeing then that we have a great High Priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast [our] confession.
- 15 For we do not have a High Priest who cannot sympathize with our weaknesses, but was in all [points] tempted as [we are, yet] without sin. 16 Let us therefore come boldly to the throne of grace, that we may obtain
- mercy and find grace to help in time of need.
