Jesus' Last Words (Acts 1:4-5): STAY & WAIT

Jesus working in us takes **time**. He works through a progression of processes to mature us, to equip us, and to qualify us for ministry. We must patiently participate.

Jesus directed and designed the church to begin as a group and to remain as a group, a **unit**. In Acts, we will see the church in action, working as a unit.

Jesus does not intend for us as believers to function on our own. God has given His **Promise**, the Holy Spirit, Who connects us to Jesus, indwells us, empowers us, fills us, and seals us. We will study the Holy Spirit extensively in the Book of Acts.
