A BRIEF LOOK AT WHAT JESUS DIDN'T SAY:

- 1) Jesus did not reprimand the apostles for the question.
- 2) Jesus did not discount the apostles' question.
- 3) Jesus did not correct the apostle's question.
- 4) Jesus stated only that it was not given them to know the time of the restoration of the kingdom to Israel.
- 5) God has clearly communicated that His promises to Abraham, and more specifically David, regarding the people of Israel, and the kingdom and lineage of David, are unconditional.
- 6) We affirm dispensationalism, which takes the Bible at face value, and which understands the promises of God to Israel, as presented in the Bible, as promises God will keep. We do not discard or spiritualize them.
