# 2. A Look at Spirit Baptism in the Gospels (future: not happened yet):

## a. Matt 3:7-12 (11)

<sup>11</sup> "I indeed baptize you with water unto repentance, but He who is coming after me is mightier than I, whose sandals I am not worthy to carry. **He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire**.

- John: Is baptizing with (or in) water (*en hudati*)
- Jesus: Will baptize (future) with (or in) the Holy Spirit and fire (*en* pneumati hagio kai puri)

### b. Mark 1:5-8 (8)

8 "I indeed baptized you with water, but He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

- John: Has baptized with water (hudati)
- Jesus: Will baptize with the Holy Spirit (*en pneumati hagio*)

# c. Luke 3:15-17 (16)

<sup>16</sup> John answered, saying to all, "I indeed baptize you with water; but One mightier than I is coming, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to loose. **He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire**.

- John: Is baptizing with (in) water (hudati)
- Jesus: Will baptize with (in) the Holy Spirit and fire (*en pneumati hagio kai puri*)

## d. John 1:29-34 (33)

<sup>33</sup> "I did not know Him, but He who sent me to baptize with water said to me, `Upon whom you see the Spirit descending, and remaining on Him, this is He who baptizes with the Holy Spirit.'

- John: Is to be baptizing with (or in) water (en hudati)
- Jesus: He who baptizes with the Holy Spirit (*en pneumati hagio*)

# 3. A Look at Spirit Baptism in Acts 1:5 (yet future):

<sup>4</sup> And being assembled together with *them*, He commanded them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the Promise of the Father, "which," *He said*, "you have heard from Me; <sup>5</sup> "for John truly baptized **with water**, but you shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now.

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- John: Has baptized with water (hudati)
- Apostles: Will be baptized with Holy Spirit (en pneumati ... hagio)
  - 1) Promise of the Father = baptism in the Holy Spirit
  - 2) Baptism would happen in the very near future (a few days)

# 4. A Look at Spirit Baptism in Acts 11:15-17 (history: already happened):

<sup>15</sup> "And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them, as upon us at the beginning. <sup>16</sup> "Then I remembered the word of the Lord, how He said, 'John indeed baptized with water, but you shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit.' <sup>17</sup> "If therefore God gave them the same gift as *He gave* us when we believed on the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could withstand God?"

- Holy Spirit fell upon them as upon us at the beginning = Pentecost
- Peter equates Pentecost with baptism of the Holy Spirit
- Any Spirit activity proved these believers rec'd Spirit baptism also
- The "fire" part had not happened at Pentecost just Spirit baptism
- You shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit (en pneumati hagio)

# 5. A Look at Spirit Baptism in 1 Cor 12:13 (doctrinal: explanation)

<sup>13</sup> For by one Spirit we were all baptized into one body-- whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves or free-- and have all been made to drink into one Spirit.

- For **by** one Spirit (**en** heni pneumati) Could be "**in** one Spirit"
- We were all baptized every believer (not limited to spiritual, etc.)
- Into one body

# 6. What Does Spirit Baptism Mean?

~	Either we are baptized	the Spirit or	the Spirit
u.	Littlei we die buptized	the Spirit of	the Spirit

- 1) Jesus uses the Spirit to baptize us into His body OR
- 2) Jesus baptizes us in the Spirit OR
- 3) Both (in the Spirit AND by the Spirit into the body)

#### b. Which is correct? I lean towards #2...

- 1) The same phrase (en pnemati) is used in all seven instances
- 2) John baptized **en** water most natural to be **en** Spirit as well
- 3) Whatever is done with Spirit is done with fire (Matt & Luke)
- 4) A single baptism is mentioned in the Gospel passages
- 5) A single baptism is indicated in 1 Corinthians 12:13
- 6) A single baptism is cited in Ephesians 4:5
- 7) Baptized into His death (Rom 6) does not require another baptism
- 8) This can be solved by a single baptism (illustration)
