Summary Statements:

- TWO FOCUSES: The Word (not just "the Gospel") and the response of those that hear it are the key focuses. The emphasis is not the messenger but the message and the response of those that hear the message. Ultimately we are responsible for how we respond to what we hear. The message is the same. The determining factor is the receiver's heart.
- CONVERSION & CONDUCT: The response deals with more than conversion. The expectation of stability, maturity and fruitfulness can only be made of believers (those that are saved). Maturity and fruitfulness occur over time. Most actions relate to what a person is doing (present tense), not a single response at a point in time.
- GOOD NEWS / BAD NEWS: Because this relates to how one is responding presently, It is possible to move from one level of soil to another – both directions (except to become unsaved again).
- ONE MEASURE: The focus is a person's ongoing response to the Word of God. One's life can be measured and summarized in how he/she is living or is not living by what the Word says.
- ESSENTIALS OF FRUITFULNESS: Fruitfulness requires listening to the Word of God, learning the Word of God, holding on to the Word of God, living by the Word in spite of certain difficulty. It takes depth, rejection of distraction, and patience in the midst of inevitable trouble that comes.
