## Jesus Will Reward in The Future What We Do Today (Luke 12:41-48)

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## How Does Luke 12:41-48 Apply to People Today?

1. Unbelievers will still be judged for rejecting God, and then judged based upon their works. The final penalty for all unbelievers is the lake of fire.

2 Thes 1:7-10 and to *give* you who are troubled rest with us when the Lord Jesus is revealed from heaven with His mighty angels, <sup>8</sup> in flaming fire taking vengeance on those who do not know God, and on those who do not obey the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ. <sup>9</sup> These shall be punished with everlasting destruction from the presence of the Lord and from the glory of His power, <sup>10</sup> when He comes, in that Day, to be glorified in His saints and to be admired among all those who believe, because our testimony among you was believed.

Rev. 20:12-15 And I saw the dead, small and great, standing before God, and books were opened. And another book was opened, which is *the Book* of Life. And the dead were judged according to their works, by the things which were written in the books. <sup>13</sup> The sea gave up the dead who were in it, and Death and Hades delivered up the dead who were in them. And they were judged, each one according to his works. <sup>14</sup> Then Death and Hades were cast into the lake of fire. This is the second death. <sup>15</sup> And anyone not found written in the Book of Life was cast into the lake of fire.

2. For any unbelievers, their ultimate need is to believe on Jesus' work on the cross. The only way you can prepare for God is to accept by belief Jesus' payment on the cross for your sins.

John 3:16-18, 36 <sup>16</sup> "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life. <sup>17</sup> "For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world through Him might be saved. <sup>18</sup> "He who believes in Him is not condemned; but he who does not believe is condemned already, because he has not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God. <sup>36</sup> "He who believes in the Son has everlasting life; and he who does not believe the Son shall not see life, but the wrath of God abides on him."

 $2\ \text{Cor}\ 5{:}21\ \text{For}\ \text{He}$  made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him.

3. Believers can be thankful that Jesus took all of their sins on the cross. Believers still will be judged by their works, whether good or bad, and then gain or lose eternal rewards based upon their faithfulness.

2 Cor 5:9-10 Therefore we make it our aim, whether present or absent, to be well pleasing to Him. <sup>10</sup> For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, that each one may receive the things *done* in the body, according to what he has done, whether good or bad.

1 Cor 3:12-15 Now if anyone builds on this foundation *with* gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, straw, <sup>13</sup> each one's work will become clear; for the Day will declare it, because it will be revealed by fire; and the fire will test each one's work, of what sort it is. <sup>14</sup> If anyone's work which he has built on *it* endures, he will receive a reward. <sup>15</sup> If anyone's work is burned, he will suffer loss; but he himself will be saved, yet so as through fire. (cf. Rom 14:7-12)

4. As believers, this passage shows us how fully Jesus has saved us, including all our sins after salvation. Jesus' payment on the cross remains the basis on which we receive ongoing forgiveness when we confess our sins to continue our fellowship with God.

1 John 1:5 – 2:2 This is the message which we have heard from Him and declare to you, that God is light and in Him is no darkness at all.  $^6$  If we say that we have fellowship with Him, and walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth.  $^7$  But if we walk in the light as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus Christ His Son cleanses us from all sin.  $^8$  If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us.  $^9$  If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us *our* sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.  $^{10}$  If we say that we have not sinned, we make Him a liar, and His word is not in us.  $^{2:1}$  My little children, these things I write to you, so that you may not sin. And if anyone sins, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous.  $^2$  And He Himself is the propitiation for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the whole world.

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1 Cor 6:9-20 Do you not know that the unrighteous will not inherit the kingdom of God? Do not be deceived. Neither fornicators, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor homosexuals<sup>1</sup>. nor sodomites, <sup>10</sup> nor thieves, nor covetous, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor extortioners will inherit the kingdom of God. 11 And such were some of you. But you were washed, but you were sanctified, but you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus and by the Spirit of our God. <sup>12</sup> All things are lawful for me, but all things are not helpful. All things are lawful for me, but I will not be brought under the power of any. 13 Foods for the stomach and the stomach for foods, but God will destroy both it and them. Now the body is not for sexual immorality but for the Lord, and the Lord for the body. 14 And God both raised up the Lord and will also raise us up by His power. 15 Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ? Shall I then take the members of Christ and make them members of a harlot? Certainly not! 16 Or do you not know that he who is joined to a harlot is one body with her? For "the two," He says, "shall become one flesh1." 17 But he who is joined to the Lord is one spirit with Him. 18 Flee sexual immorality. Every sin that a man does is outside the body, but he who commits sexual immorality sins against his own body. <sup>19</sup> Or do you not know that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you, whom you have from God, and you are not your own? 20 For you were bought at a price; therefore glorify God in your body¹ and in your spirit, which are God's.

Titus 2:11-14 For the grace of God that brings salvation has appeared to all men, <sup>12</sup> teaching us that, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righteously, and godly in the present age, <sup>13</sup> looking for the blessed hope and glorious appearing of our great God and Savior Jesus Christ, <sup>14</sup> who gave Himself for us, that He might redeem us from every lawless deed and purify for Himself *His* own special people, zealous for good works.
