Exodus 14:16 ¹⁶ "But lift up your rod, and stretch out your hand over the sea and divide it. And the children of Israel shall go on dry <i>ground</i> through the midst of the sea.
Exodus 14:21 ²¹ Then Moses stretched out his hand over the sea and the LORD caused the sea to go <i>back</i> by a strong east wind all that night, and made the sea into dry <i>land</i> , and the waters were divided.
Exodus 14:22 ²² So the children of Israel went into the midst of the sea on the dry <i>ground</i> , and the waters <i>were</i> a wall to them on their right hand and on their left.
