What Should a Father Teach His Children? – Part 2 (Proverbs)

- **1. Fear the Lord** (starting here; humbling yourself; trusting God; hating sin)
- 2. Pursue True Wisdom (know wisdom's source & value; focus on it)
- **3. Honor Your Parents** (listen to them; learn from them)
- **4.** Choose Good Companions (avoid bad companions; find good ones)
- 5. Seek Moral Purity (protect mind; know sin's pull & cost; quard steps)

6. Practice Thoughtful Discernment

a. To avoid temptation

2:3 Yes, if you cry out for discernment, *And* lift up your voice for understanding,

2:10-17 When wisdom enters your heart, And knowledge is pleasant to your soul, ¹¹ Discretion will preserve you; Understanding will keep you, ¹² To deliver you from the way of evil, From the man who speaks perverse things, ¹³ From those who leave the paths of uprightness To walk in the ways of darkness; ¹⁴ Who rejoice in doing evil, *And* delight in the perversity of the wicked; ¹⁵ Whose ways *are* crooked, And *who are* devious in their paths; ¹⁶ To deliver you from the immoral woman, From the seductress *who* flatters with her words, ¹⁷ Who forsakes the companion of her youth, And forgets the covenant of her God.

5:1-4 My son, pay attention to my wisdom; Lend your ear to my understanding, ² That you may preserve discretion, And your lips may keep knowledge. ³ For the lips of an immoral woman drip honey, And her mouth *is* smoother than oil; ⁴ But in the end she is bitter as wormwood, Sharp as a two-edged sword.

28:7 Whoever keeps the law *is* a discerning son, But a companion of gluttons shames his father.

b. To make good decisions

3:21-23 My son, let them not depart from your eyes-- Keep sound wisdom and discretion; ²² So they will be life to your soul And grace to your neck. ²³ Then you will walk safely in your way, And your foot will not stumble.

15:21 Folly *is* joy *to him who is* destitute of discernment, But a man of understanding walks uprightly.

19:11 The discretion of a man makes him slow to anger, And his glory is to overlook a transgression.

22:3 A prudent *man* foresees evil and hides himself, But the simple pass on and are punished.

c. To prepare for the future

6:6-8 Go to the ant, you sluggard! Consider her ways and be wise, ⁷ Which, having no captain, Overseer or ruler, ⁸ Provides her supplies in the summer, *And* gathers her food in the harvest.

7. Apply Yourself Diligently

a. Use time wisely

19:15 Laziness casts *one* into a deep sleep, And an idle person will suffer hunger.

24:30-34 I went by the field of the lazy *man*, And by the vineyard of the man devoid of understanding; ³¹ And there it was, all overgrown with thorns; Its surface was covered with nettles; Its stone wall was broken down. ³² When I saw *it*, I considered *it* well; I looked on *it and* received instruction: ³³ A little sleep, a little slumber, A little folding of the hands to rest; ³⁴ So shall your poverty come *like* a prowler, And your need like an armed man.

26:14 As a door turns on its hinges, So does the lazy man on his bed.

b. Work hard

13:4 The soul of a lazy *man* desires, and *has* nothing; But the soul of the diligent shall be made rich.

18:9 He who is slothful in his work Is a brother to him who is a great destroyer.

20:4 The lazy *man* will not plow because of winter; He will beg during harvest and *have* nothing.
