17 Then it came to pass, when Pharaoh had let the people go, that God did not lead them <i>by</i> way of the land of the Philistines, although that <i>was</i> near; for God said, "Lest perhaps the people change their minds when they see war, and return to Egypt." ¹⁸ So God led the people around <i>by</i> way of the wilderness of the Red Sea. And the children of Israel went up in orderly ranks out of the land of Egypt. *Archaeology further confirms that this northern route was heavily garrisoned by Egypt. God Allows Things to Get Worse God may allow a situation to become worse:

- ⁹ So the Egyptians pursued them, all the horses *and* chariots of Pharaoh, his horsemen and his army, and overtook them camping by the sea beside Pi Hahiroth, before Baal Zephon. ¹⁰ And when Pharaoh drew near, the children of Israel lifted their eyes, and behold, the Egyptians marched after them. So they were very afraid, and the children of Israel cried out to the LORD.
- (1) to make His name to be made known [14:18];
- (2) to show His followers His greatness;
- (3) to render punishment on His enemies;
- (4) to bring even greater blessing [no more pursuing...]

God may lead us into a "no-win" situation. Our response should be to cry out to God.

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11 Then they said to Moses, "Because <i>there were</i> no graves in Egypt, have you taken us away to die in the wilderness? And the children of Israel shall go on dry <i>ground</i> through the midst of the sea.	 11. God Says "Don't Pray, Act!" God Promises Complete Victory Over Pharaoh & all his army So that the Egyptians know
¹⁹ And the Angel of God, who went before the camp of Israel, moved and went behind them; and the pillar of cloud went from before them and stood behind them. ²⁰ So it came between the camp of the Egyptians and the camp of Israel. Thus it was a cloud and darkness <i>to the one</i> , and it gave light by night <i>to the other</i> , so that the one did not come near the other all that night.	 God <u>Protects</u> by Moving <u>Between</u> God takes the well-being of His followers personal (Mt 28:20) Where God leads, He takes personal responsibility also to provide and protect (as He chooses)
 Then Moses stretched out his hand over the sea; and the LORD caused the sea to go <i>back</i> by a strong east wind all that night, and made the sea into dry <i>land</i>, and the waters were divided. So the children of Israel went into the midst of the sea on the dry <i>ground</i>, and the waters <i>were</i> a wall to them on their right hand and on their left. 	 14. God Reveals His <u>Limitless</u> Power A dead-end to us is simply an opportunity to God to show us His power God is not limited by our solutions or nature God is not limited by our abilities (the Israelites did NOTHING to defeat their enemy!)
²³ And the Egyptians pursued and went after them into the midst of the sea, all Pharaoh's horses, his chariots, and his horsemen. ²⁴ Now it came to pass, in the morning watch, that the LORD looked down upon the army of the Egyptians through the pillar of fire and cloud, and He troubled the army of the Egyptians. ²⁵ And He took off their chariot wheels, so that they drove them with difficulty; and the Egyptians said, "Let us flee from the face of Israel, for the LORD fights for them against the Egyptians."	15. God <u>Fights</u> for His People
²⁶ Then the LORD said to Moses, "Stretch out your hand over the sea, that the waters may come back upon the Egyptians, on their chariots, and on their horsemen." ²⁷ And Moses stretched out his hand over the sea; and when the morning appeared, the sea returned to its full depth, while the Egyptians were fleeing into it. So the LORD overthrew the Egyptians in the midst of the sea. ²⁸ Then the waters returned and covered the chariots, the horsemen, <i>and</i> all the army of Pharaoh that came into the sea after them. Not so much as one of them remained. ²⁹ But the children of Israel had walked on dry <i>land</i> in the midst of the sea, and the waters <i>were</i> a wall to them on their right hand and on their left. ³⁰ So the LORD saved Israel that day out of the hand of the Egyptians, and Israel saw the Egyptians dead on the seashore. ³¹ Thus Israel saw the great work which the LORD had done in Egypt; so the people feared the LORD, and believed the LORD and His servant Moses.	16. God Is Thorough & Purposeful God knows what He's doing! Results of God's Working: God a. Protected them from main route guard (13:17) b. Made God's name known to the Egyptians (14:18) c. Wiped out pursuing enemy (14:30b) d. Gave evidence of what God could do (14:31a) e. Engendered fear toward God (14:31b) f. Gave confidence in God (14:31c) g. Gave confidence in God's leader Moses (14:31d) h. Caused enemies to fear, setting them up for victory
