²⁹ `These also <i>shall be</i> unclean to you among the creeping things that creep on the earth: the mole, the mouse, and the large lizard after its kind; ³⁰ `the gecko, the monitor lizard, the sand reptile, the sand lizard, and the chameleon. ³¹ `These <i>are</i> unclean to you among all that creep. Whoever touches them when they are dead shall be unclean until evening.	8. Unclean Things
³² `Anything on which <i>any</i> of them falls, when they are dead shall be unclean, whether <i>it is</i> any item of wood or clothing or skin or sack, whatever item <i>it is</i> , in which <i>any</i> work is done, it must be put in water. And it shall be unclean until evening; then it shall be clean. ³³ `Any earthen vessel into which <i>any</i> of them falls you shall break; and whatever <i>is</i> in it shall be unclean: ³⁴ `in such a vessel, any edible food upon which water falls becomes unclean, and any drink that may be drunk from it becomes unclean. ³⁵ `And everything on which <i>a part</i> of <i>any such</i> carcass falls shall be unclean; <i>whether it is</i> an oven or cooking stove, it shall be broken down; <i>for</i> they <i>are</i> unclean, and shall be unclean to you.	9. ³⁷ `And if a part of <i>any such</i> carcass falls on any planting seed which is to be sown, it <i>remains</i> clean. ³⁸ `But if water is put on the seed, and if <i>a part</i> of <i>any such</i> carcass falls on it, it <i>becomes</i> unclean to you.	11. What About?
³⁹ `And if any animal which you may eat dies, he who touches its carcass shall be unclean until evening. ⁴⁰ `He who eats of its carcass shall wash his clothes and be unclean until evening. He also who carries its carcass shall wash his clothes and be unclean until evening.	12. Clean Animals that Have?
⁴¹ `And every creeping thing that creeps on the earth <i>shall be</i> an abomination. It shall not be eaten. ⁴² `Whatever crawls on its belly, whatever goes on <i>all</i> fours, or whatever has many feet among all creeping things that creep on the earth these you shall not eat, for they <i>are</i> an abomination. ⁴³ `You shall not make yourselves abominable with any creeping thing that creeps; nor shall you make yourselves unclean with them, lest you be defiled by them.	13.
