Numbers 5:1 And the LORD spoke to Moses, saying: ² "Command the children of Israel that they put out of the camp every leper, everyone who has a discharge, and whoever becomes defiled by a corpse. ³ "You shall put out both male and female; you shall put them outside the camp, that they may not defile their camps in the midst of which I dwell." ⁴ And the children of Israel did so, and put them outside the camp; as the LORD spoke to Moses, so the children of Israel did.

(**Leviticus 15:31** ' Thus you shall separate the children of Israel from their uncleanness, lest they die in their uncleanness when they defile My tabernacle that *is* among them.)

- ⁵ Then the LORD spoke to Moses, saying, ⁶ "Speak to the children of Israel: 'When a man or woman commits any sin that men commit in unfaithfulness against the LORD, and that person is guilty, ⁷ 'then he shall confess the sin which he has committed. He shall make restitution for his trespass in full, plus one-fifth of it, and give *it* to the one he has wronged. ⁸ 'But if the man has no relative to whom restitution may be made for the wrong, the restitution for the wrong *must go* to the LORD for the priest, in addition to the ram of the atonement with which atonement is made for him. ⁹ 'Every offering of all the holy things of the children of Israel, which they bring to the priest, shall be his. ¹⁰ 'And every man's holy things shall be his; whatever any man gives the priest shall be his.'
- ¹¹ And the LORD spoke to Moses, saying, ¹² "Speak to the children of Israel, and say to them: 'If any man's wife goes astray and behaves unfaithfully toward him, ¹³ 'and a man lies with her carnally, and it is hidden from the eyes of her husband, and it is concealed that she has defiled herself, and *there was* no witness against her, nor was she caught -- ¹⁴ 'if the spirit of jealousy comes upon him and he becomes jealous of his wife, who has defiled herself; or if the spirit of jealousy comes upon him and he becomes jealous of his wife, although she has not defiled herself -- ¹⁵ 'then the man shall bring his wife to the priest. He shall bring the offering required for her, one-tenth of an EPHAH of barley meal; he shall pour no oil on it and put no frankincense on it, because it *is* a grain offering of jealousy, an offering for remembering, for bringing iniquity to remembrance.
- ¹⁶ ' And the priest shall bring her near, and set her before the LORD. ¹⁷ 'The priest shall take holy water in an earthen vessel, and take some of the dust that is on the floor of the tabernacle and put *it* into the water. ¹⁸ 'Then the priest shall stand the woman before the LORD, uncover the woman's head, and put the offering for remembering in her hands, which *is* the grain offering of jealousy. And the priest shall have in his hand the bitter water that brings a

1. God commands concerning those who are

- a. They are to be put out of the camp.
 - Lepers (Lev 13; 14:2,3; 22:4)
 - Those with a discharge (Lev. 15; 22:4)
 - Those defiled by a corpse (Lev. 11;31,32; 21)
- b. No gender preferences
- c. In order that they do not defile the camp
- d. Israel obeyed.

2. God Instructs concerning_

- a. The sin unfaithfulness against the Lord
- b. He shall:
 - Confess it (Responsibility toward God)
 - Make restitution (Responsibility toward man)
- c. The condition if there are no relatives in which to make restitution: The restitution goes to the priest
- d. The sacrifice a ram of atonement
- e. The ownership. What belongs to the priest:
 - Every offering of the holy things
 - Whatever the man gives to the priest.

3. God instructs concerning

- a. The situation:
 - They wife commits adultery
 - It is hidden from the eyes of the husband
 - There is no witness, she is not caught
- b. The husband's response
 - A sprit of jealousy comes upon him
 - Whether the wife is guilty or not

 - The man will bring his wife to the priest
 - He will bring an offering

 - The priest creates a solution (of water)
 - The wife's head is uncovered
 - The wife holds the grain offering
 - The priest puts the wife under an oath
 - The wife agrees to the oath

himself unclean even for his father or his mother, for his brother or his sister, when they die, because his separation to God is on his head. ⁸ 'All the days of his separation he shall be holy to the LORD. ⁹ ' And if anyone dies very suddenly beside him, and he defiles his consecrated head, then he shall shave his head on the day of his cleansing; on the seventh day he shall shave it. 10 'Then on the eighth day he shall bring two turtledoves or two young pigeons to the priest, to the door of the tabernacle of meeting; 11 'and the priest shall offer one as a sin offering and the other as a burnt offering, and make atonement for him, because he sinned in regard to the corpse; and he shall sanctify his head that same day. ¹² 'He shall consecrate to the LORD the days of his separation, and bring a male lamb in its first year as a trespass offering; but the former days shall be lost, because his separation was defiled. ¹³ ' Now this *is* the law of the Nazirite: When the days of his

- separation are fulfilled, he shall be brought to the door of the tabernacle of meeting. ¹⁴ 'And he shall present his offering to the LORD: one male lamb in its first year without blemish as a burnt offering, one ewe lamb in its first year without blemish as a sin offering, one ram without blemish as a peace offering, 15 'a basket of unleavened bread, cakes of fine flour mixed with oil, unleavened wafers anointed with oil, and their grain offering with their drink offerings. ¹⁶ 'Then the priest shall bring them before the LORD and offer his sin offering and his burnt offering; ¹⁷ 'and he shall offer the ram as a sacrifice of peace offering to the LORD, with the basket of unleavened bread; the priest shall also offer its grain offering and its drink offering. ¹⁸ 'Then the Nazirite shall shave his consecrated head at the door of the tabernacle of meeting, and shall take the hair from his consecrated head and put it on the fire which is under the sacrifice of the peace offering. ¹⁹ 'And the priest shall take the boiled shoulder of the ram, one unleavened cake from the basket, and one unleavened wafer, and put them upon the hands of the Nazirite after he has shaved his consecrated hair, ²⁰ 'and the priest shall wave them as a wave offering before the LORD; they are holy for the priest, together with the breast of the wave offering and the thigh of the heave offering. After that the Nazirite may drink wine.' 21 " This is the law of the Nazirite who vows to the LORD the offering for his separation, and besides that, whatever else his hand is able to provide; according to the vow which he takes, so he must do according to the law of his separation."
- And the LORD spoke to Moses, saying: 23 "Speak to Aaron and his sons, saying, 'This is the way you shall bless the children of Israel. Say to them: ²⁴ "The LORD bless you and keep you; ²⁵ The LORD make His face shine upon you, And be gracious to you; ²⁶ The LORD lift up His countenance upon you, And give you peace." ' ²⁷ "So they shall put My name on the children of Israel, and I will bless them."

- He shall not even go near family members if they die
- He is bound by his separation to God
- He is to remain holy
- The "what if": if someone happens to die while they are near
 - Shave his head on the day of his cleansing
 - On the eighth day he brings an offering
 - He is sanctifying his head
 - The former days of his vow does not count.
- What happens at the end of the days of his vow.
 - He is to be brought to the tabernacle
 - He shall bring an offering
 - The priest shall offer the offering
 - He shall save his head at the door of the tabernacle.
 - He shall burn his hair on the altar
 - He may have additional responsibilities to offer based on his vow.

 - The Lord be gracious to you Gracious - lit. "show favor"
 - The Lord lift up His countenance upon you Lift up His countenance - lit. "lift up His face"
 - The Lord give you peace (shalom)
