God's Faithfulness

- 1. God has kept a number of promised to Israel throughout their wandering. Two are seen in this passage:
 - a. God is preparing Israel to give to them the land He has promised to them.
 - b. God has let die all those of the first generation of the Exodus except Caleb and Joshua.
- 2. While the focus is on the negative (God punishing Israel for their unbelief), God's faithfulness should be something that encourages us and gives us peace.

 (Psalm 36:5ff)

Psalm 37:3-9 ³ Trust in the LORD, and do good; **Dwell** in the land, and **feed** on <u>His faithfulness</u>. ⁴ **Delight** yourself also in the LORD, And He shall give you the desires of your heart. ⁵ **Commit** your way to the LORD, **Trust** also in Him, And He shall bring *it* to pass. ⁶ He shall bring forth your righteousness as the light, And your justice as the noonday. ⁷ **Rest** in the LORD, and **wait** patiently for Him; **Do not fret** because of him who prospers in his way, Because of the man who brings wicked schemes to pass. ⁸ **Cease** from anger, and **forsake** wrath; Do not fret -- *it* only *causes* harm. ⁹ For evildoers shall be cut off; But those who wait on the LORD, They shall inherit the earth.
