## TIMELINE OF TRUTH: Deuteronomy 15:1-18 – God Directs Generosity Towards the Poor

¹ "At the end of <i>every</i> seven years you shall grant a release <i>of debts</i> . (14:28) ² "And this <i>is</i> the form of the release: Every creditor who has lent <i>anything</i> to his neighbor shall release <i>it</i> ; he shall not require <i>it</i> of his neighbor or his brother, because it is called the LORD'S release. 12 "If your brother, a Hebrew man, or a Hebrew woman, is sold to you and serves you six years, then in the seventh year you shall let him go free from you. (Ex 21:2-8; Lev 25:39-43)  13 "And when you send him away free from you, you shall not let him go away empty-handed; 14 "you shall supply him liberally from your flock, from your threshing floor, and from your winepress. ## Exodus 23:10-11

- <sup>10</sup> "Six years you shall sow your land and gather in its produce,
- <sup>11</sup> "but the seventh *year* you shall let it rest and lie fallow, that the poor of your people may eat; and what they leave, the beasts of the field may eat. In like manner you shall do with your vineyard *and* your olive grove.

### Leviticus 25:1-7

- <sup>1</sup> And the LORD spoke to Moses on Mount Sinai, saying,
- <sup>2</sup> "Speak to the children of Israel, and say to them: `When you come into the land which I give you, then the land shall keep a sabbath to the LORD.
- <sup>3</sup> 'Six years you shall sow your field, and six years you shall prune your vineyard, and gather its fruit; <sup>4</sup> 'but in the seventh year there shall be a sabbath of solemn rest for the land, a sabbath to the LORD. You shall neither sow your field nor prune your vineyard.
- <sup>5</sup> What grows of its own accord of your harvest you shall not reap, nor gather the grapes of your untended vine, for it is a year of rest for the land.
- <sup>6</sup> `And the sabbath *produce* of the land shall be food for you: for you, your male and female servants, your hired man, and the stranger who dwells with you, <sup>7</sup> `for your livestock and the beasts that *are* in your land-- all its produce shall be for food.

#### Exodus 21:2-8

- <sup>2</sup> "If you buy a Hebrew servant, he shall serve six years; and in the seventh he shall go out free and pay nothing.
- <sup>3</sup> "If he comes in by himself, he shall go out by himself; if he comes in married, then his wife shall go out with him.
- <sup>4</sup> "If his master has given him a wife, and she has borne him sons or daughters, the wife and her children shall be her master's, and he shall go out by himself.
- <sup>5</sup> "But if the servant plainly says, `I love my master, my wife, and my children; I will not go out free,'
- <sup>6</sup> "then his master shall bring him to the judges. He shall also bring him to the door, or to the doorpost, and his master shall pierce his ear with an awl; and he shall serve him forever.
- <sup>7</sup> "And if a man sells his daughter to be a female slave, she shall not go out as the male slaves do.
- <sup>8</sup> "If she does not please her master, who has betrothed her to himself, then he shall let her be redeemed. He shall have no right to sell her to a foreign people, since he has dealt deceitfully with her.

### Leviticus 25:39-43

- 39 'And if one of your brethren who dwells by you becomes poor, and sells himself to you, you shall not compel him to serve as a slave.
- <sup>40</sup> 'As a hired servant and a sojourner he shall be with you, and shall serve you until the Year of Jubilee.
- <sup>41</sup> `And *then* he shall depart from you-- he and his children with him-- and shall return to his own family. He shall return to the possession of his fathers.
- <sup>42</sup> `For they are My servants, whom I brought out of the land of Egypt; they shall not be sold as slaves.
- <sup>43</sup> You shall not rule over him with rigor, but you shall fear your God.

### On "Release":

- The difficulty referred to [translating "release"] is whether a debt was to be terminated permanently, or suspended for the year, menacing that
  repayment could not be demanded during the course of the seventh year. The latter alternative seems more probable; in the seventh year,
  when the land was left fallow, many people would not have been in a position to repay a debt because of the temporary interruption of their
  normal source of income. NICOT p.236
- Here we have an enlarged exposition of the previously given law. The debtor was not to be pressed then for what he owed and nothing was to be exacted from him. While the land rested all debts and obligations had also to rest. It does therefore not mean a complete remission of all debts forever. And liked with this merciful institution is the promise of blessing. GCC p. 175

## On "Lending":

- Throughout the Word of God the poor are mentioned to be remembered in kindness and some most blessed promises are given to those who obey these gracious words. See Proverbs 14:21; 19:17; 22:9; 28:8,27; Ps. 41:1. Oppression of the poor is a sin, which God specially marks. See Isaiah 3:14,15; 10:2; Ezek. 18:11-13; Amos 2:6; 4:1; 5:11; James 2:6. When the Lord comes He will remember the poor and deliver them. See Ps. 72:2,4,12,13; 113:7; 132:15; Isaiah 11:4. GCC p.176
- Prov 19:17 He who has pity on the poor lends to the LORD, And He will pay back what he has given.
- Prov 22:9 He who has a generous eye will be blessed, For he gives of his bread to the poor.
- Prov 28:27 He who gives to the poor will not lack, But he who hides his eyes will have many curses.
- Note, however, that it is not charity, in the sense of almsgiving, that is advocated here; it is a charitable attitude to be expressed by lending the
  poor man whatever he needs for himself, while he pledged to repay the loan in due course (v.8). NICOT p.237

#### On "Debt-Service":

• "... the reason for the sale would be default in the repayment of a debt, and a period of servitude would substitute for that repayment." NICOT p.238

# New Testament Summary Verses:

- Acts 20:34-35 Yes<sup>1</sup>, you yourselves know that these hands have provided for my necessities, and for those who were with me. <sup>35</sup> "I have shown you in every way, by laboring like this, that you must support the weak. And remember the words of the Lord Jesus, that He said, `It is more blessed to give than to receive.'
- 2 Cor 9:5-8 Therefore I thought it necessary to exhort the brethren to go to you ahead of time, and prepare your generous gift beforehand, which you had previously promised, that it may be ready as a matter of generosity and not as a grudging obligation. <sup>6</sup> But this I say: He who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and he who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. <sup>7</sup> So let each one give as he purposes in his heart, not grudgingly or of necessity; for God loves a cheerful giver. <sup>8</sup> And God is able to make all grace abound toward you, that you, always having all sufficiency in all things, may have an abundance for every good work.
- Gal 6:10 Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all, especially to those who are of the household of faith.
- Heb 13:16 But do not forget to do good and to share, for with such sacrifices God is well pleased.
