Joshua 4:1-3 And it came to pass, when all the people had completely crossed over the Jordan, that the LORD spoke to Joshua, saying: ² "Take for yourselves twelve men from the people, one man from every tribe, ³ "and command them, saying, 'Take for yourselves twelve stones from here, out of the midst of the Jordan, from the place where the priests' feet stood firm. You shall carry them over with you and leave them in the lodging place where you lodge tonight.' 15 Then the LORD spoke to Joshua, saying, 16 "Command the priests who bear the ark of the Testimony to come up from the Jordan." 17 Joshua therefore commanded the priests, saying, "Come up from the Jordan." 18 And it came to pass, when the priests who bore the ark of the covenant of the LORD had come from the midst of the Jordan, and the soles of the priests' feet touched the dry land, that the waters of the Jordan returned to their place and overflowed all its banks as before.

¹⁹ Now the people came up from the Jordan on the tenth *day* of the first month, and they camped in Gilgal on the east border of Jericho. ²⁰ And those twelve stones which they took out of the Jordan, Joshua set up in Gilgal.

- 2. The water returned to normal
 - i. As soon as the priest came out of the Jordan
 - ii. As soon as their feet touched the dry land
 - iii. The river overflowed its banks as before

- 1. They came up from the Jordan on the tenth day of the first month
- 2. They camped in Gilgal East border of the Jordan
- 3. Joshua set up the other 12 stones at their camp

8. Joshua Explains the ______ of the Stones

- 1. They will be asked why the stones are here
- 2. Joshua gives them an answer:
 - i. Israel crossed over on dry land
 - ii. God dried up the waters of the Jordan
 - iii. Just like He dried up the Red Sea
 - iv. So that all the people may know that the hand of the Lord is mighty
 - v. That Israel may fear the Lord forever
