We are impacted by large-scale and personal apostasy, adversity, and tragedy, but God is <u>always</u> actively in control.

Either way, He remains in control. Acted on need, not fleshly desires (1 John 2:15-17; Luke 8:14) Compare with Lot (Genesis 13:1-13; cf. 1 Pet 4:1-3) Prov 3:5-6 and Titus 2:11-14 should govern our decisions.
