Observations & Lessons:

- 1. God works through what may appear to be random choices on our part to accomplish His will.
- 2. God acts on our choices of obedience. This would not have happened if Ruth had not (1) followed Naomi to Bethlehem; (2) taken action to provide for Naomi.
- 3. God works over long periods of time to prepare the necessary circumstances to accomplish His will.
