Timeline of Truth - Ruth 2:18-23 - Ruth Returns Home from Gleaning, and Naomi Responds

THEME (Overall Book Idea): God always rules:	A rhyme that captures these ideas:	
 even when we cannot know what He is doing 	- God is <i>always</i> in control Though we may be unaware.	
 even when it takes many years 	- And God may work over many years And allow troubles hard to bear.	
- even when God allows us to suffer	- But God is <i>always</i> in control We can <i>trust His</i> loving care.

Ruth 1:1-5 - Trouble Comes with Life

We are impacted by large-scale and personal apostasy, adversity, and tragedy, but God is always actively in control. When the judges ruled (cultural apostasy), famine (widespread adversity), and deaths of husband/sons (personal tragedy).

Ruth 1:5-7 – Naomi Makes Difficult Decisions (A secondary lesson, but one that is evident here.)

We are to make wise decisions built from the truths of the Bible to honor God.

Naomi had assess her situation, evaluate her choices, choose the most righteous choice, & act on that choice by returning to Judah.

Ruth 1:8-18 – Naomi Seeks to Provide a Better Future for Her Daughters-in-Law

God wants us to make significant, permanent, often costly life choices for Him.

Naomi makes a selfless decision to send her daughters-in-law home; Ruth makes a selfless choice to stay with Naomi.

Ruth 1:19-22 - Naomi Enters Bethlehem (with Ruth) Greeted But Grieved

Circumstances that we cannot control (beyond our obedience) are controlled by God, and require us to trust Him.

Naomi expressed her heart and circumstances and tied her circumstances to God's ultimate control.

Ruth 2:1-3 - Ruth Seeks to Provide, and God Works Out Details

God works through our choices of active obedience and wisdom to accomplish His will through us.

Ruth purposes to serve and provide for her mother-in-law, gleaning in the fields as allow for the poor and widows, and God works.

Ruth 2:4-17 - Boaz Rewards Ruth's Choices

Ruth works hard as a gleaner, and organized Boaz takes note and provides direction, provision, protection, and encouragement.

- The example of <u>Boaz</u> exhorts us to care for the needy, and especially to encourage those who seek to serve God.
- The example of Ruth exhorts us to work hard as we sacrificially serve others and as we ultimately serve God.
- 1. Boaz Arrives at the Field (Belief in the LORD is the central focus in the life of Boaz.)
- 2. Boaz Asks Regarding Ruth's Protector (Boaz reaffirms the assigned protection for women.)
- 3. Boaz Receives the Answer (**Boaz operates intentionally and responsibly**.)
- 4. Boaz Instructs Ruth to Work in His Field (Boaz actively cares for those in need in planned detail.)
- 5. Ruth Questions Boaz in Grateful Humility (Ruth is aware that she is rightfully seen as an outsider.)
- 6. Boaz Explains His Actions (Boaz encourages those that live righteously, sacrificially, and spiritually for the LORD.)
- 7. Ruth Receives Boaz's Kindness in Grateful Humility
- 8. Boaz Makes Extra Provision for Ruth (Boaz provided the opportunity for Ruth to maximize her time and effort. He did not remove the need for her to work, but allowed her to work as profitably as possible.)
- 9. Ruth Works Very Hard, All Day, All the Way (Ruth takes no shortcuts in work, in time, or in process.)

Ruth 2:17 So she [Ruth] gleaned in the field until evening, and beat out what she had gleaned, and it was about an ephah of barley.

Ruth 2:18-23 – Ruth Returns Home from Gleaning, and Naomi Responds

Naomi begins to see the work of God amid her sufferings as He acts through the loyal, loving efforts of Ruth.
