1.	A Attitude (1, 6a-b) – leadership is initiative – Jonathan's attitude was,						
	"Let's try it and see what God will do", rather than "It probably won't work so let's not try."						
	Initiative involves:						
	• Doing what others are not doing, or are refusing to do.						
	• Leaving your comfortable surroundings to go to where the problem is.						
	Choosing to act, beyond just thinking or talking about acting						
	Trying to succeed, rather than assuming failure and stifling efforts						
	 Identifying a problem, and making it your problem, not just a topic of conversation (how many could see the garrison?) 						
2.	An (6a) – seeing a need, seeking a solution, choosing to do something about it, concentrating one's focus and efforts on a specific area.						
3.	A in the Lord (6c-d) – "For nothing restrains the LORD from saving by many or by few."						
4.	An Understanding of the of (7)						
	• involve whoever you can, to do more than you can do by yourself – a team of two defeated 20!						
	• you don't need an army – use those that are able, willing, and faithful						
	• some <i>lead</i> , some <i>follow</i> – <i>both</i> are necessary to fight						
	• teamwork is bi-directional – the armor-bearer said "I am with you", and he was! It involves fulfilling your responsibilities completely and thoroughly.						
5.	A Defined Set of (8-11)						
	Plan the process ("stand and show")						
	• Identify evaluation/decision points (if, then; stay or go up)						
	"If they call us up, then we will go up, because that will give us an element of surprise (they wouldn't expect us to attack). If they tell us to wait, then we will get out of here, for that would allow them to have the advantage to strategize and the ability to surround us (we'll go knock on another garrison's door)."						
6.	A Sense of Responsibility for Your (12-14)						
	• Take <i>responsibility</i> for your <i>area</i> . Do <i>what</i> you <i>can</i> , <i>where</i> you <i>can</i> , <i>when</i> you <i>can</i> .						
	• How do you eat an elephant? One bite at a time. How do you win a war? One fight at a time.
