## 1 Timothy 3:1-7: What Does a Man Need to Be to Become a Pastor? 14 Maturity Traits Required of Potential Pastors & Expected of All Believers

<sup>2</sup> A bishop then must be blameless, the husband of one wife, temperate, soberminded, of good behavior, hospitable, able to teach; <sup>3</sup> not given to wine, not violent, not greedy for money, but gentle, not quarrelsome, not covetous; <sup>4</sup> one who rules his own house well, having [his] children in submission with all reverence <sup>5</sup> (for if a man does not know how to rule his own house, how will he take care of the church of God?); <sup>6</sup> not a novice, lest being puffed up with pride he fall into the [same] condemnation as the devil. <sup>7</sup> Moreover he must have a good testimony among those who are outside, lest he fall into reproach and the snare of the devil.

These are God's *requirements* for overseers (pastors, elders). They are also presented in such a way that indicates that these are *expected* behaviors for ALL men (and all believers, except that which would be gender-specific). These traits give evidence of *active spiritual maturity* (though not spiritual perfection). These 14 traits are what God wants us as men to be, and what God wants us to raise our boys to be. *God desires & expects men to become:*
