### I. The Three-Fold Problem at Corinth

A. Separations (17-19)

<u>Schisms</u> – divisions by wrong attitudes or choices

<u>Heresies</u> – deviations from orthodox teaching

# II. The Example and Commands of the Lord Jesus

**A. The Timing of His Commands** (23; John 13)

"in the night in which He was betrayed"

He had just washed the feet of those that would:

- forsake Him,
- deny Him, and
- betray Him!

# B. The Meaning of the Bread (24)

"this is my body ... for you" - sacrificial payment

C. The Meaning of the Cup (25)

"This cup is the <u>new covenant</u> in My blood." – sa procurement

**D.** The Extent of the Commands (26)

Mandatory ("this do [command] in remembrance of Me")

<u>Continuous</u> ("as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup")

<u>Declarative</u> ("you proclaim the Lord's death")

Expectant ("till He comes")

# A. Condemnation (27)

## **B.** Command #1 – Examination (28)

(Solution to Problem #1 – Separations)

Examine what? General evaluation and confession of sin?

Am I relating properly to the Body? Do I have a correct view of the Body as one?

Does a believer choose to participate? Not, let him examine then decide whether to participate or not. There's no option of non-participation.

# **C. Explanation** (29, cp 34))

His "for you" body! (24)

1 Cor 10:17 – For we, *though* many, are one bread *and* one body; for we all partake of that one bread.

1 Cor 12:12-14 - <sup>12</sup> For as the body is one and has many members, but all the members of that one body, being many, are one body, so also *is* Christ. <sup>13</sup> For by one Spirit we were all baptized into one body -- whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves or free -- and have all been made to drink into one Spirit. <sup>14</sup> For in fact the body is not one member but many. (12:12-27 – How many times is "body" used?)

## D. Chastisement (30-32)

Jesus takes division in His body seriously.

Jesus takes the treatment of His body personally.

"Saul, Saul. Why are you persecuting Me?"

1 Cor 3:16-17; 8:12

## E. Commands #2 & #3 (33-34)

(Solutions to Problems #2 & #3)

- 1. Solution for Shaming <u>Wait</u> for one another (33) 10:23-24; 10:31-33
- 2. Solution for Selfishness Eat at home (34)

#### Review

- Are you divisive, or are you committed to the one bread, one body?
- Are you considering others in the body, putting them before yourself?
- Are you assembling with the purpose of meeting the needs of others, rather than your own needs?
