## A Closer Look at Communion #6:

**Paul Talks About Much More than Crackers & Juice** (1 Cor 11:17-34, P2)

The persistent problem when observing communion in our churches:

## Using 1 Corinthians 11:23-25 but Ignoring its CONTEXT.

<sup>17</sup> Now in giving these instructions do not praise *you*, since **you come together** not for the better but for the worse.

<sup>18</sup> For first of all, when **you come together** <u>as a church</u>, I hear that there are divisions among you, and in part I believe it. <sup>19</sup> For there must also be factions among you, that those who are approved may be recognized among you.

<sup>20</sup> Therefore when **you come together** <u>in one place</u>, it is not to eat the Lord's Supper. <sup>21</sup> For in eating, each one takes his own supper ahead of *others*; and one is hungry and another is drunk. <sup>22</sup> What! Do you not have houses to eat and drink in? Or do you despise the church of God and shame those who have nothing? What shall I say to you? Shall I praise you in this? I do not praise *you*.

<sup>23</sup> For I received from the Lord that which I also delivered to you: that the Lord Jesus on the *same* night in which He was betrayed took bread; <sup>24</sup> and when He had given thanks, He broke *it* and said, "Take, eat; this is My body which is broken for you; do this in remembrance of Me." <sup>25</sup> In the same manner *He* also *took* the cup after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in My blood. This do, as often as you drink *it*, in remembrance of Me." <sup>26</sup> For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death till He comes.

<sup>27</sup> Therefore whoever eats this bread or drinks *this* cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of the body and blood of the Lord. <sup>28</sup> But let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of the bread and drink of the cup. <sup>29</sup> For he who eats and drinks in an unworthy manner eats and drinks judgment to himself, not discerning the Lord's body. <sup>30</sup> For this reason many *are* weak and sick among you, and many sleep. <sup>31</sup> For if we would judge ourselves, we would not be judged. <sup>32</sup> But when we are judged, we are chastened by the Lord, that we may not be condemned with the world.

<sup>33</sup> Therefore, my brethren, when **you come together** <u>to eat</u>, wait for one another.

<sup>34</sup> But if anyone is hungry, let him eat at home, lest **you come together** <u>for judgment</u>. And the rest I will set in order when I come.
