### Are You a Disciple of Jesus? – Part 5: Your Purpose (Luke 14:34-35)

#### **REVIEW:**

### Three Elements Are Required for True Discipleship:

- 1. Placing God's Truth into My Head LEARNING Pedagogy
- 2. Putting God's Truth into My Actions LIVING Practice
- 3. Prioritizing God's Truth in My Choices LEAVING Priorities

We must be learning, and living what we learn, and leaving our priorities for new priorities (Luke 14:25-35).

### Leaving Requires Changes to Three Key Areas of Priority:

1. God Precedes All PEOPLE (God Displaces All Relationships)

<sup>26</sup> If anyone comes to Me and **DOES NOT** <u>hate</u> his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, yes, and his own life also, **he cannot be My disciple**.

- 2. God Defines All PURSUITS (God Replaces All Ambitions)
  - <sup>27</sup> And whoever **DOES NOT** <u>bear</u> his cross and <u>come after</u> Me **cannot be My disciple**.
- 3. God Controls All POSSESSIONS (God Governs All Belongings)
  - <sup>33</sup> So likewise, whoever of you **DOES NOT** <u>forsake</u> all that he has **cannot be My disciple**.

### Jesus Gives Two Examples of Counting the Cost: Building & Fighting

- Jesus shares these to illustrate the importance of counting the cost.
- Jesus has counted the cost, and these 3 priorities reflect that cost.

## **Avoid Common Errors People Make About These Parables**

- 1. Error #1: Trying to Define All the Details
- 2. Error #2: Relating this Passage to Salvation
- 3. Error #3: Suggesting Discipleship Is Only for the Serious

# Find Biblically Consistent Clarity in These Parables

- 1. Works Can Never Save You
- 2. Discipleship Is Not Optional
- 3. Jesus, Not You, Counts the Cost

# Summary Thoughts on the Two Parables

- Jesus is not offering the option of discipleship; He is defining it.
- Jesus is describing the obedient Christian life; the only other life is a life of disobedience and rejection of His revealed will for your life.
