Each shepherding function seems to have an inappropriate, imbalanced, or sinful. Examples of this in the feeding area: teaching error by not studying (2 Tim 2:15), or by embracing doctrines of devils (1 Tim 4:1); teaching harshly, rather than with patience and gentleness (2 Tim 2:24); teaching what people want to hear rather than what they need to hear (2 Tim 4:3-4); teaching what one does not know (1 Tim 1:3-7).
