Biblical Watershed Issues: Who Teaches the Believer? #4

The Bible gives commands and parameters to different groups to teach believers.

- PASTORS Teach Believers Pastors are given to equip the saints (Eph 4:12)

 all believers, not just the men or the adults. This would include teaching men, women, and children (not exclusively pastors teach children, but so do their parents & others). Pastors are appointed by God to oversee local assemblies and are required to be men.
- **2. BELIEVERS Teach One Another** We are all to teach and admonish one another. This is not limited to the men or adults. In light of James 3:1, this pertains primarily to passing on what we have been taught by our pastors.
 - **Col 3:16** Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom, **teaching and admonishing one another** in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord.
 - Compared with James 3:1, this seems to relate to repetitive teaching, repeating what one has been taught.

Heb 5:12 – 6:2 For though by this time **you ought to be teachers**, you need [someone] to teach you again the first principles of the oracles of God; and you have come to need milk and not solid food.

 This pertains to each and every believer. Each is expected to learn, understand, and be able to repeat the first principles of the Christian faith.

With this category of teaching:

- a) There is no specific qualifications or skills.
- b) There is also no formal appointment.
- c) There is no elevated accountability.
- d) This implies only **informal teaching** while interacting with one another
- e) The content concerns learning and passing on (six) basic truths.
- **3. THOSE GIFTED WITH THE GIFT OF TEACHING Teach Believers** These are some (a few?) that are given the spiritual gift of teaching. If this giftedness is not limited to pastors, all restrictions must still be identified and observed (1 Cor 14:34; 1 Tim 1:3-7; 2:11-14; James 3:1).
 - **1 Cor 12:28** And God has appointed these in the church: first apostles, second prophets, third **teachers**, after that miracles, then gifts of healings, helps, administrations, varieties of tongues. (cf. 1 Pet 4:10-11)
 - As it parallels Eph 4:11 listing apostles & prophets, "teachers" seems to relate to the position of pastor-teacher, and thus limited to men.

Rom 12:6-7 Having then gifts differing according to the grace that is given to us, [let us use them:] ... he who **teaches**, in teaching;

- There are some that are specifically enabled by the Spirit with special teaching ability. This teaching gift is not limited to authoritative teaching. One can use his or her ability to research, organize, relay, and communicate what he or she has been taught.

4. OLDER WOMEN Teach Younger Women (Titus 2:3-5) – This seems to be informal woman to woman instruction, and deals specifically with key areas of *womanly conduct* and *attitudes* regarding womanly roles and responsibilities. Older, experienced godly women teach younger wives and mothers, and those soon to be such.

Titus 2:3-5 the older women likewise, that they be reverent in behavior, not slanderers, not given to much wine, teachers of good things -- that they admonish the young women to love their husbands, to love their children, to be discreet, chaste, homemakers, good, obedient to their own husbands, that the word of God may not be blasphemed.

Observations of This Assignment:

a.	Assignment: Addressing [all] older women,
	this indicates an informal, ongoing process in contrast to formal
	positions, structures, or classes. There is no specific position defined
	and no specific qualifications listed for a formal position.
	- There are no qualifications for non-male teachers anywhere in Scripture.
	- This would consist of repetitive teaching. (James 3:1 vs Col 3:16)
b.	Assignment: Only woman-to-woman (cf. 1 Tim 2:11-15)
c.	Assignment: [All] older women teaching
	younger women; experienced teaching inexperienced; relational.

- d. _____ Assignment: What is taught are specific, gender-role related topics attitudes, relationships, roles as wife, mother, and woman nothing else.
 - This assignment is not an open assignment. It is not giving permission to teach everything, anything, anyone, or anywhere. This instruction defines clear, specific content in a specific scenario and a specific direction.
 - There is no assignment to teach "authoritatively" in key passages discussing women's roles (Gen 1-2; Prov 31; **EMPHASIS** 1 Tim 5:9-14; Titus 2:4-5)
 - There are specific restrictions against women teaching (or teaching men, or teaching authoritatively): 1 Tim 2:11-15

SCOPE REMINDER: Any teaching must remain within the boundaries of the rest of Scripture. Women cannot be pastors and thus do pastoral ("authoritative") teaching. (This would apply to writing of the same nature, it seems.)

- **1 Cor. 14:34** Let your women keep silent in the churches, for they are not permitted to speak; but *they are* to be submissive, as the law also says.
- 1 Tim. 2:11-14 Let a woman learn in silence with all submission. ¹² And I do not permit a woman to teach or to have authority over a man, but to be in silence. ¹³ For Adam was formed first, then Eve. ¹⁴ And Adam was not deceived, but the woman being deceived, fell into transgression.
- **James 3:1** My brethren, let not many of you become teachers, knowing that we shall receive a stricter judgment.
